#### WATERTOWN CHILDREN'S THEATRE

- **Onstage:** WCT's production seasons features eight productions that offer participants of all ages the opportunity to work as part of an ensemble, gain confidence, and take pride in their accomplishments as they hone advanced skills in singing, acting, and movement/dance. Parents/ Guardians join the fun as they work together on offstage committees to help bring the production to life. Each Onstage program culminates in a fully staged production for the public.
- **Inspired By:** Inspired by a variety of sources from favorite works of literature to the natural world to current events participants of all ages will collaborate, explore their creative ideas, and find their individual voices as they build visual and performing arts skills.
- **Experiment With:** Participants will develop new skills or further their confidence in a favorite area! From drawing to sculpting and creative movement to Shakespeare, participants can experiment with a world of artistic possibilities.
- Write from The Heart: Motivated by topics that are close to their hearts, participants experience the exciting growth of narrative from concept to execution as they put their ideas on paper and then see them brought to life in images or on stage.
- Maker Space: Clay, sewing, jewelry-making, and prop creation are just a few of the exciting areas that participants may explore! Makerspace participants work directly with teaching artists to develop and hone their skills as they design and craft objects with their own hands.
- Workshops and Intensives: Workshops and intensives are short-term, specialized classes led by local and visiting artists that help participants sharpen their skills, simply have some fun, or try something new!
- Family Jam: Engage with art alongside your loved ones! Our Family Jam programs are designed for kids and their grown-ups to create, play, and explore the arts together.
- **Ignite:** Participants in WCT's CYC and the Visual Arts ARTery programs ignite their passion for the arts as they delve deeply into the inner workings of our performing and visual arts programs.

- School Year Vacation Programs: Students in our school year vacation programs will spark their creativity as they gain hands on experience in several areas of visual and performing arts including: 2D/Drawing & Painting, 3D/Sculpture, Movement & Music, and Acting/Playmaking. Students are grouped based on age.
- Summer Stage and Studios: 10 weeks of summer programming cover grades K-12 and provide a new theme and experience each week. Students have the opportunity to collaborate with their ensembles, explore their interests and participate in on and offstage programming. Each week ends in a celebratory showcase for friends and family.
- Additional Programming: Private lessons (voice, acting and fine arts) where students focus on developing individual skills to further their confidence and creativity; Birthday Parties using performing and fine arts as a tool to bring groups together in celebration; Scout badge workshops; Off-Site Programming where custom programs are created with schools to further classroom curriculum goals and/or experience a new, enriching art form; Student Matinee Performances offer visiting school groups the opportunity to experience high quality, education theatre as they watch a performance, engage with thematic concepts via a study guide, and participate in a talk back with the cast; Homeschool Programs are customized to meet the needs of homeschool curriculums

#### CAMP MITCHMAN

• Custom designed curriculum tailored to the needs of students in each of the three groups. Using two musicals — *Chicken Little* and *Sleeping Beauty Jr.*, elementary students learn about their own personal strengths and the how to use these strengths to work as part of an ensemble. Expanding upon this in the high school program, curriculum continues to emphasize identity exploration and group work while putting a more specific focus on developing performance skills.
